## Project Lahar Jal Abhiyan



It is a student-led initiative implemented by Street Cause GRIET, aimed at providing safe drinking water to school children in rural Telangana. Over 270 students and staff now have access to clean, purified drinking water throughout the day, helping create a healthier, more supportive learning environment.
